Rationale for Wind Power at WSSC Water

- Need renewable wind power to help meet our Greenhouse Gas reduction goal of 60% by 2035
- Currently, energy suppliers are required to provide 10% green energy
- Comply with MD Clean Energy Jobs Act (2019) SB 516:
 - 50% green energy required by 2028
 - 14.5% solar
 - 2.5% for offshore wind
 - 33% for other green resources



Wind Contract Terms: Previous vs. New

	Previous Wind Contract	New Wind Contract
Purchased From	Constellation Energy	Directly from wind farm (wholesale)
% of WSSC Water annual energy consumption purchased	33%	33%
Kilowatt-hours (kWh) Per Year	70,000,000	70,000,000
Contract Term	10 years (2008 – 2017)	10 Years (2020 – 2030)
Cost per kWh	\$.064 fixed	\$.043 fixed
Total Cost	\$44.8 million	\$30 million
Renewable Energy Credits (RECs)	Included	Included

Nearly \$15 million savings compared to previous contract



Why IO Years?

- Standard term for wholesale wind power
- WSSC Water receives better price with long-term contract
- Price is fixed for 10 years
- Price is competitive now with conventional power
- Conventional power rates expected to increase over the next 10 years
- RECs are projected to increase in price as a result of SB 516

• Proposals received October 2, 2019

• Evaluation Committee October 22, 2019

• Negotiating Terms & Conditions Current

• Commission approval February 19, 2020
