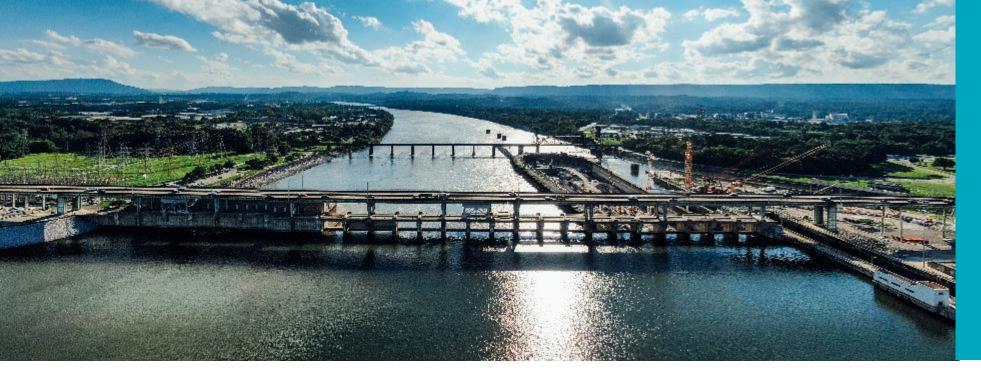

Overview of WSSC Water's Disparity Study

Why does WSSC Water need to conduct a disparity study?

- The Croson (City of Richmond v. J.A. Croson, 488 U.S. 469 (1989)) decision required local government agencies' race preference contracting programs be able to withstand strict scrutiny review to avoid violating the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment. Strict scrutiny must be met by:
 - Demonstrating a "compelling interest" in the remedial purpose of the MWBE program and,
 - Ensuring that the program is "narrowly tailored" to meet the remedial goal.



2020 Disparity Study

Study Objectives

- Determine the utilization and availability of minority- and women-owned firms within WSSC Water's market area for construction, architectural and engineering, goods and services and professional services.
- Determine whether disparity exists, and if found, identify by race, ethnicity, and gender of affected individuals.
- Provide best practices to assist in administering the MBE/SLBE programs and the establishment of an overall aspirational goal.
