<p><b>MONTGOMERY COUNTY HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM</b></p>	<p>Emergency assistance is available to Montgomery County residents. <p><b>PRINCE GEORGE’S COUNTY HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM</b></p>	<p>The Prince George’s County Department of Social Services (DSS) is dedicated to helping low-income families and individuals living in Prince George’s County move to income independence through the Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) program.</p> <p>Temporary Cash Assistance (TCA) provides cash assistance to needy families with dependent children when available resources do not fully address the family’s needs, and while preparing program participants for independence through work.</p> <p>Families with minor children can receive TCA for a total of 60 months (5 years) over a lifetime. Sanctions may be imposed for not complying with program requirements.</p> <p><b>Eligibility</b> The program has a requirement for all work eligible applicants to seek</p>



	<p>employment and participate fully in work requirement activities from the day they apply for benefits. Additionally, all applicants must document cooperation with child support and compliance with substance abuse provisions.</p> <p><b>Interpretation Services</b> Interpretation Services are available free of charge for limited English proficiency customers. <p><b>INTERFAITH WORKS CONNECTIONS – MONTGOMERY COUNTY</b></p>	<p>Interfaith Works Connections links low-income residents of Montgomery County to the resources they need. The Resource Coordinators, who are bilingual in English and Spanish, meet with those in need of assistance at the <a href="#">Interfaith Works Clothing Center</a> to conduct a comprehensive needs assessment, gather</p> <p>information to make referrals to appropriate partner providers, and educate clients about available assistance.</p> <p>Referrals are made to <b>many types of services</b>, including food, vocational services, English/literacy classes, furniture, and behavioral health.</p> <p>Interfaith Works Connections also <b>works with neighbors in financial crisis</b> to provide a safety net and prevent evictions and utility cutoffs subject to funding availability.</p> <p>The IW Connections Resource Coordinators meet with clients <b>by appointment only</b> at the Interfaith Works Clothing Center at 751 Twinbrook Parkway, Rockville.</p> <p>Call directly for assistance: 240-641-6307.</p>

<p><b>MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (DHCD) ASSISTED HOUSING RELIEF PROGRAM</b></p>	<p>The Assisted Housing Relief Program is an eviction prevention program intended to help bring rental delinquencies current and provide relief for tenants through direct payments to their eligible property management company. Tenants in eligible properties will be credited rent rebates paid directly to the property management company, which will eliminate their rental debt and the threat of eviction.</p> <p>The program serves rental units in multifamily projects financed by DHCD's Community Development Administration using state funds or federal resources, such as the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit program where the unit rent is controlled.</p> <p><b><u>Eligible Applicants for Assisted Housing Relief Program:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Eligible applicants will be tenants who can certify that the cause of their rent delinquency is COVID-19 related.</li> <li>• Applications will be collected and consolidated by property managers and submitted to DHCD.</li> <li>• <b>Timeline:</b> Applications will be accepted from <b>December 2, 2020 - December 18, 2020</b> from eligible property managers.</li> </ul>

<p><b>PRINCE GEORGE’S COUNTY EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM – COVID-19</b></p>	<p>A program administered by the Prince George’s County Department of Social Services (DSS) provides eligible County residents who are facing a financial hardship due to COVID-19, assistance with rent, utilities and other emergency needs. Individuals or families in need of financial help can contact the agency via email to request an application: <a href="mailto:emergency.assistanceccsd@maryland.gov">emergency.assistanceccsd@maryland.gov</a>.</p> <p>Owners with tenant-occupied properties whose tenants are behind on rental payments should encourage tenants to apply for assistance.</p>
<p><b>EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM FOR CITY OF BOWIE RESIDENTS</b></p>	<p>The City of Bowie COVID-19 Emergency Rent Assistance Program provides short-term rental assistance to eligible households who have lost income due to the COVID-19 pandemic and caused them to fall behind on their rent. You <b>MUST</b> be a resident of the City of Bowie to apply. <p><b>ZION CHURCH – PRINCE GEORGE’S COUNTY</b></p>	<p>Zion Church is one of several faith and community-based organizations that has partnered with Prince George’s County to disburse additional funds from the CARES Act to provide financial relief to residents who have been impacted by COVID-19.</p>

<b>FINANCIAL RESOURCES</b>	
<p><b>STATE OF MARYLAND HOMEOWNER’S TAX CREDIT PROGRAM</b></p>	<p>The State of Maryland has the Homeowners’ Tax Credit Program in place, which allows credits against the homeowner’s property tax bill if the property taxes <u>exceed</u> a fixed percentage of the person’s gross income. In other words, it sets a limit on the amount of property taxes any homeowner must pay based upon his or her income.</p> <p>Before your eligibility according to income can be considered, you <b>must</b> meet four basic requirements:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You must own or have a legal interest in the property.</li> <li>• The dwelling on which you are seeking the tax credit must be your principal residence where you live at least six months of the year, including July 1, unless you are a recent home purchaser or unless you are unable to do so because of your health or need of special care.</li> <li>• Your net worth, not including the value of the property on which you are seeking the credit or any qualified retirement savings or Individual Retirement Accounts, must be less than \$200,000.</li> <li>• Your combined gross household income cannot exceed \$60,000.</li> </ul> <p>Homeowners' and Renters' tax credit applications can be filed online through <a href="http://www.taxcredits.sdat.maryland.gov">http://www.taxcredits.sdat.maryland.gov</a></p> <p><b>SDAT’s Tax Credits office located at State Center in Baltimore will be closed to the public until further notice.</b> The Department strongly encourages online filing when possible, since applications filed online will be processed significantly faster than those filed by mail. Applications will be reviewed 60-90 days after they are submitted.</p>
<p><b>STATE OF MARYLAND’S RENTERS’ TAX CREDIT PROGRAM</b></p>	<p>The Renters' Tax Credit Program provides property tax credits for renters who meet certain requirements. The plan was modeled after and designed to be similar in principle to the Homeowners' Tax Credit Program.
