




WSSC WATER AT A GLANCE

Established in 1918, WSSC Water is the largest water/wastewater utility in Maryland and among the largest in the nation. Our service area spans approximately 1,000 square miles in Prince George's and Montgomery counties. We proudly serve 1.9 million residents with safe and reliable drinking water and help protect the Chesapeake Bay by treating and returning clean water back to Maryland waterways.

Avenel Property History



- WSSC Water bought 395 acres from Rock Run developer for \$11 million in 1988 to construct an Advanced Wastewater Treatment (AWT) Plant
- WSSC Water conveyed 225 acres to PGA/TPC at Avenel for \$10 for golf course development.
 (Additionally, WSSC Water-owned land used for driving range, access roads and subsequent widening, and use of fields for professional tournament parking)
- WSSC's 170 acres Advanced Wastewater Treatment Plant
 - 50 acres in center for AWT
 - 75 acres primary buffer
 - 44 acres secondary buffer
- TPC golf course and WSSC Water-owned land to create a buffer between the plant and community







Current Uses on WSSC Water Property:

- Public ballfields/recreational areas, at no cost to the community
- Environmentally protected land, which was swapped with land used for Avenel Swim and Tennis Club
- Avenel HOA landscaping storage, at no cost to the community
- TPC driving range/access roads/land to support the PGA golf tournament
- Monopole provided to cellular carriers
- Equestrian center and trails





- WSSC Water has supported the operation of the Avenel Equestrian Center for 31 years, from 1992 until the present, without any public or private support
- Equestrian Center Lease Status:
 - Executed in 1999 (prior agreement executed in 1992)
 - o Expired in 2009
 - Hold over tenancy from 2009 to Dec. 1, 2023
 - WSSC Water granted a license to tenant to remain on the property until June 1, 2024, without charge





- Barn structure is exhibiting the kind of deterioration expected from an aging facility
- WSSC Water recently expended approximately \$100,000 for an emergency stabilization repair to ensure temporary safety of the barn
- Safety concerns for individuals and animals led to the need to terminate the hold over tenancy for the barn
- Although 60-day notice was required, provided 180-day notice
- Also allowing tenant to remain on site for an additional 180 days at no charge to remove personal belongings


