A Note from WSSC Water's Intergovernmental Relations Office

Legislators continue to craft legislation and negotiate solutions to address the state's financial challenges. On Friday, February 21 Senate Budget and Taxation Chair Guy Guzzone stated that House and Senate leadership are prepared to make up to \$500 million in budget cuts as they wait to see what happens if the Federal Government does or does not approve a continuing resolution on March 14. The State Board of Estimates is expected to release the newest fiscal projections on March 9 which will also inform legislators on additional actions that may need to be taken.

Additionally, legislators examined one of Governor Moore's budget legislative proposals which includes potential cuts to the state's Blueprint for Maryland's Future in the Excellence in Maryland Public Schools Act (SB 429/ HB 504). The proposed bill would defer some elements of the multibillion-dollar, 10-year Blueprint plan as the state faces a \$3 billion budget shortfall next year. In a joint hearing this week, one of the provisions that garnered a great deal of feedback was the provision that would pause funding towards the Blueprint's goal of increasing "collaborative time" for teachers. Increased collaborative time would require hiring thousands more teachers, which the administration says is not feasible under current economic conditions. The administration also calls for keeping funding for community schools at current levels, which opponents argue would negatively impact students most in need.

IRO is on the front-line advocating for legislation that impacts our work. We cover a variety of subject matters and focus on legislation that helps fulfill our Smart One Water Mission and analyze the impact of state and federal legislation on WSSC Water. We ensure all communities thrive by ethically delivering safe, reliable and sustainable water and wastewater services. In every home, every business, we make everything possible by ensuring access to dependable and safe water for everyday life.

Legislative Updates

All WSSC Water-sponsored and related bills have completed the bi-county legislative process and will now be heard before the House of Delegate's Environment and Transportation Committee. Our WSSC Water-sponsored bill <u>HB 1063</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Design and Construction – Alternative Project Delivery and Solicitation Methods will be heard on Tuesday, February 25, and <u>HB 1168</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Service Charges will be heard Thursday, March 6. Staff will be present at both hearings and provide testimony.

<u>HB 1064</u> Montgomery County Planning Board and Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Open Meetings – Live Streaming (Palakovich Carr) will also be heard Thursday, March 6. Both bills, <u>HB 1230</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – System Development Charge – Exemptions (Moon) and <u>HB 1195</u> Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Membership, Transparency, Billing, and Planning (WSSC Transparency and Reform Act of 2025) (Korman, Wilkins, Barnes) were voted favorably with amendments by the delegations and await hearing dates.

SB 654 Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission – Raw Water Pipeline Project – Audit (Rosapepe) was voted favorably by the Prince George's County Senate Delegation and will be heard before the Education, Energy, and Environment Committee on Tuesday, February 25. The House bill version of SB 732 (HB 909) Sewage Sludge Utilization Permits – Per – and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances – Concentration Limits will be heard before the Environment and Transportation Committee on Wednesday, February 26, 2025. WSSC Water staff will provide informational testimony on the impacts of both bills.


Identifying WSSC Water Employees
