


Water Main Replacement Project Overview



- WSSC Water is replacing aging water mains to enhance service and reliability.
- Rustler Construction is replacing 2.27 miles of water main pipe from 6 16 inches to 8 16 inches, including 429 house connections.
- Current water mains installed between 1940 and 1960.
- New water mains will be zinc-coated ductile iron pipes, with life expectancy of 100+ years.

Construction schedule is estimated and weather dependent.

What to Expect During Construction

- Work schedule: 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday Friday
 - Closing of lanes will start at 9 a.m. per the Department of Permitting, Inspections and Enforcement permit.
 - Conditions at some locations may require different work hours.
 - Residents will be notified at least 48 hours in advance for water shutdowns.
- Construction activities may include:
 - Marking locations of utilities
 - Field inspections
 - \odot Replacement of water mains, fire hydrants, and services





Traffic Impacts

- Construction activities may require temporary changes to traffic patterns; managed to minimize disruptions
- Access to homes maintained during construction
 - Access into homes <u>NOT</u> required
 - \circ Access onto private property generally $\underline{\textbf{NOT}}$ required

• Parking restrictions

- WSSC Water will provide 48-hour advance notice (denoted by "No Parking" signs) before any parking restrictions
- Any vehicles not removed from the designated area will be towed to a nearby street at no cost to owner
- Final restoration of sidewalks, roadways and landscaping will take place within 90 days of construction completion



Paving Procedures

- Replace temporary patches with permanent ASAP.
- Daily inspections of temporary patches and steel plates.
- Corrections made before contractor leaves job site.
- Final paving and striping in phases, when possible.





Signage and Restoration



- Construction signs with contact persons placed throughout project area
- Projects completed during winter months are permanently paved and restored to their original state or better the following spring (when applicable)
