SUMMARY OF DECISION

On or about August 15, 2016, a Complaint was filed with the Board of Ethics

(Board) alleging that a Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) employee

working in the Infrastructure Systems Group had violated the Code of Ethics. The Board

held a hearing on the Complaint on January 11, 2018.

After considering evidence and argument, the Board, on April 12, 2018, issued an

opinion holding that the Respondent had violated Section 3-1(a)(2) of the Code of Ethics by

participating in WSSC matters that involved a WSSC contractor that employed

Respondent's daughter. Section 3-1(a)(2) of the Code of Ethics prohibits WSSC employees

from participating in WSSC matters that involve a business entity that employees a

"qualifying relative." Pursuant to § 1-3(s) of the Code of Ethics, "qualifying relative"

includes a child.

In accordance with the authority as set forth in § 2-5(c) of the Code of Ethics, the

Board recommended that disciplinary action be taken.
